September 21, 2022

The eighty-first meeting of the Tobacco Master Settlement Agreement Compliance Advisory Board was convened on September 21, 2022 by conference call.

III. Old Business

A. E-Cigarettes/JUUL

- JUUL agreement in principal: signed by 34 states after two year investigation. If finalized, states would file consent judgments in their court with injunctive relief such as no youth targeting, limited signs, proper agerestrictions on websites. Kentucky would receive \$14 million over 5-10 years, including \$1 million as a bonus for participating in the case.
- Market share(8/22): Vuse-39%, JUUL-29%, Njoy-2.9%, blu-1.6%).

B. FDA Action

 Graphic warning challenges continue in TX, DC. Effective date extended to October 6, 2023 in TX case, more than one year after briefing has concluded.

C. Kentucky/Synar

- ABC did over 450 inspections for retail sales to minors.
- Tobacco Directory posted in July with 17 Participating Manufacturers and 10 Non-Participating Manufacturers. Korea Tobacco removed.
- PMs agreed Kentucky will have no NPM adjustment for 2021 sales.

IV. New Business

 Article discussed: "Pediatrics" study finds non-tobacco oral nicotine products were the second most prevalent nicotine product used by adolescents.
