ORDER OF DEFAULT JUDGMENT
ON THE ISSUE OF LIABILITY AND INJUNCTIVE RELIEF

LEXINGTON BLUE, INC. *et al.*

This matter having come before the Court on Motion of the Plaintiff, the Commonwealth of Kentucky *ex rel.* Russell Coleman, Attorney General of the Commonwealth of Kentucky (the “Commonwealth”) for Default Judgment against Defendants Lexington Blue, Inc. (“Lexington Blue”), Lexington Blue Lexington, LLC, Lexington Blue Louisville, LLC, Lexington Blue Cincinnati, LLC, Lexington Blue University, LLC, Lexington Blue University, Inc., Lean Dad Development, LLC, Wide Awake Consulting, LLC, Nowhere1888, LLC, and The GroundzKeeper, LLC (collectively “Entity Defendants”), and the Court having reviewed the record, including the testimony and evidence received on September 22, 2025, and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Motion for Default is **GRANTED** and it is hereby, **ORDERED, DECREED** and **ADJUDGED** as follows:

1. The Entity Defendants were personally served by in-hand delivery of the summons and Amended Complaint on November 3, 2025.
2. The Entity Defendants have failed to plead or otherwise defend this action brought by the Commonwealth within the time prescribed by CR 12.01, nor have they inferred any intent to make a defense, and, therefore, are in default pursuant to CR 55.01.
3. As a result, the factual allegations asserted in the Amended Complaint against the

Entity Defendants are deemed admitted.

4. The Entity Defendants' default and factual admissions establish they are jointly and severally liable on Counts I, II, and III of the Amended Complaint for violations of the Kentucky Consumer Protection Act and unjust enrichment.

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND ADJUDGED AS FOLLOWS:

5. The Entity Defendants willfully violated KRS 367.170 and KRS 367.628 and unjustly enriched themselves through their unlawful conduct.

6. The Entity Defendants are permanently enjoined from violating KRS 367.170, and to ensure compliance the Court incorporates and makes permanent the provisions of the Temporary Restraining Order ("TRO"), as to these defendants, entered June 2, 2025, and as amended July 15, 2025.

7. Pursuant to KRS 367.200, the Entity Defendants are ordered to pay restitution to consumers harmed by the Entity Defendants' acts and practices.

8. Pursuant to KRS 15.020, and KRS 367.110 to KRS 367.990, the Entity Defendants are ordered to disgorge all funds received through their unlawful conduct.

9. Pursuant to KRS 367.990, the Entity Defendants are required to pay civil penalties to the Commonwealth of Kentucky of not more than \$2,000 per violation of the Kentucky Consumer Protection Act ("KCPA"), or \$10,000 per violation of the KCPA where the Entity Defendants' conduct was directed at a person aged sixty (60) or older, with interest at the statutory rate for civil judgments.

10. The Commonwealth is awarded its costs and expenses herein, including litigation and investigation.

11. The Court will conduct a hearing on the issue of damages on February 13, 2026 at

2:00 p.m., to assess the monetary amount for each category of damages stated above.

This is a final and appealable order of judgment, there being no just cause for delay.
