II. Election of Chairperson

Doctor Sugarman nominated Laura Kretzer to serve as chair, and Ms. Dolores Smith seconded the nomination. The Commission unanimously approved the nomination. Ms. Kretzer will now serve as chairperson for the Commission. Mr. Sanders was not present for the vote.

III. Approval of December 12, 2025, Regular Meeting Minutes

Ms. Dallam made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Ms. Barber seconded the motion. The vote to approve was unanimous. Mr. Sanders was not present for the vote.

IV. Review and Approval of Revisions to Kentucky Model Protocol for Local Multidisciplinary Teams 2026

During its meeting on December 12, 2025, the Commission approved an updated MDT Model Protocol with some minor grammatical and formatting changes. In the editing process, additional issues were discovered. Those issues and proposed corrections were noted in a revised draft that was emailed to the Commission prior to the meeting.

The Commission did not have any questions or comments about the proposed corrections. A suggestion was made to include at least one photograph featuring teenagers to represent older youth seen at the children's advocacy centers. Doctor Sugarman made a motion to approve the proposed changes. Ms. Dallam seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved. Mr. Sanders was not present for the vote.

V. Review and Approval of Annual Report for Fiscal Year 2025

A proposed draft was sent to the Commission prior to the meeting. Stylistic changes were proposed to clarify content, and a suggestion was made to add information explaining the Multidisciplinary Enhancement Program. Doctor Sugarman made a motion to approve the annual report with the changes and additional information discussed. Ms. Paske seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

VI. Review and Approval of Local MDT Protocols

No protocols were presented.

VII. Review of Open Records Requests

No open record requests were received since the Commission's last meeting.

VIII. Partner Updates

The Administrative Office of the Courts will be offering training in April for Citizens Foster Care Review Board volunteers. The training will include a documentary on four (4) youths who aged out of care in Kentucky.
